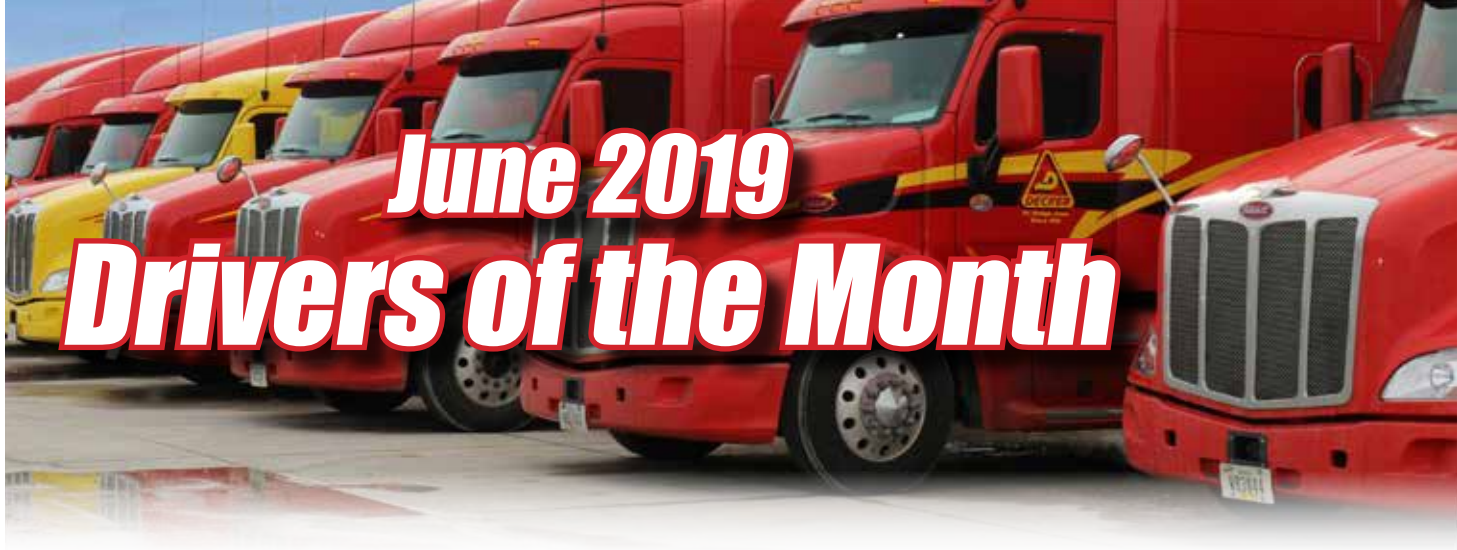

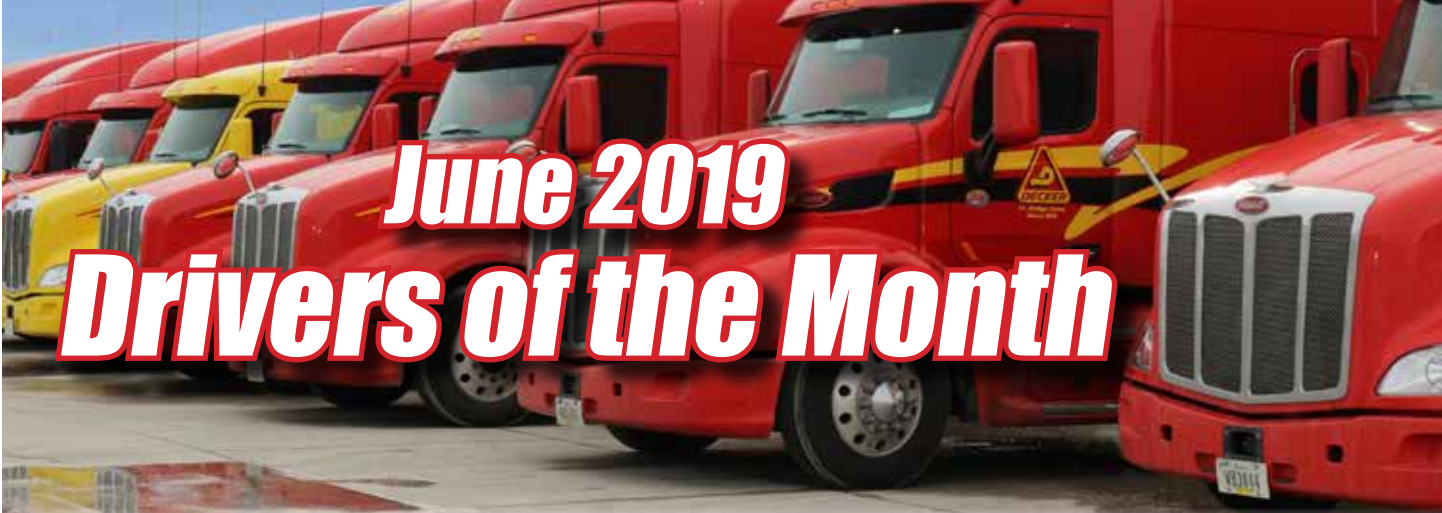


Trainer Division Anthony Clayton (3158)

Reflective Warning Devices

“Whenever a motor vehicle is stopped upon the traveled portion of a highway or the shoulder of a highway for any cause other than necessary traffic stops, the driver of the stopped vehicle shall immediately activate the vehicular hazard warning signal flashers and continue the flashing until the driver places the warning devices required...”

The above paragraph is an excerpt from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, which are the set of rules we, as drivers and motor carriers, must follow by law. Actually, most the regulations are common sense rules which have been developed over time into regulations to protect the general public from one safety hazard or another. This one is obvious

– placement of warning devices (triangles) serve as a warning to oncoming traffic that a vehicle ahead is stopped either on the highway or on the shoulder. It is believed that by putting out such a warning device that the traffic approaching the stopped unit will be able to take the appropriate actions to slow down or otherwise avoid a collision with the stopped vehicle.

Both you and I know this doesn't always happen. Unfortunately, we hear stories about or have ourselves seen instances where a vehicle has still been involved in an accident despite the driver's precautions – sometimes the triangles have even been run over by the offending vehicle! Just because this happens, don't think that putting out the required warning devices is a waste of time! Although it is easy to count the few times accidents still have occurred despite the driver's proper warnings, it is impossible to count the thousands of accidents avoided by these devices! Can you afford to be the one taking the chance that oncoming traffic will see your vehicle without them?

Consider for a moment that an accident occurs while you are stopped on the highway. When the plaintiff's attorney asks about putting out warning devices, will you be responding by saying “I didn't feel like putting them out” (helps plaintiff), or “I immediately put out warning devices to protect oncoming traffic, but the plaintiff ran over them” (helps defense)? Knowing you did the best you could do to prevent an accident is the best verdict of all, and only you will know that.

Any stop on the side of the highway should be avoided if possible. However, if it is impossible to get to the next rest area or off-highway area, the next best thing you can do is try to protect on-coming traffic by warning them using the required devices. Take a few minutes now to refresh your memory on how and when to properly place warning devices (see FMCSR 392.22 Emergency signals; stopped vehicles). By the way, once stopped, the law requires these devices be placed “as soon as possible, but in any event within 10 minutes”).
